

China launches longest manned space mission

Wider the waistline, greater the breast cancer risk: study

China launched its longest manned space mission on Monday, sending two astronauts into orbit to spend a month aboard a space laboratory that is part of a broader plan to have a permanent manned space station in service around 2022.

The Shenzhou 11 blasted off on a Long March rocket at 7:30 am (2330 GMT) from the remote launch site in Jiuquan, in the Gobi desert, in images carried live on state television.

The astronauts will dock with the Tiangong 2 space laboratory, or "Heavenly Palace 2", which was sent into space last month. It will be the longest stay in space by Chinese astronauts, state media reported.

Early on Monday, Fan Changlong, a vice chairman of China's powerful Central Military Commission, met astronauts Jing Haipeng and

Chen Dong and wished them well, state news agency Xinhua reported.

"You are going to travel in space to pursue the space dream of the Chinese nation," Fan said.

"With all the scientific and rigorous training, discreet preparation, and rich experience accumulated from previous missions, you will accomplish the glorious and tough task... We wish you success and look forward to your triumphant return." Shenzhou 11 is the third space voyage for Jing, who will command the mission and celebrate his 50th birthday in orbit.

In a manned space mission in 2013, three Chinese astronauts spent 15 days in orbit and docked with a space laboratory, the Tiangong 1.

Advancing China's space program is a priority for Beijing, with President Xi

Jinping calling for the country to establish itself as a space power.

China insists its space program is for peaceful purposes.

Shenzhou 11, whose name translates as "Divine Vessel", will also carry three experiments designed by Hong Kong middle school students and selected in a science competition, including one that will take silk worms into space.

The U.S. Defense Department has highlighted China's increasing space capabilities, saying it was pursuing activities aimed at preventing other nations using space-based assets in a crisis.

China has been working to develop its space program for military, commercial and scientific purposes, but is still playing catch-up to established space powers the United States and Russia.

China's Jade Rabbit moon rover landed on the moon in late 2013 to great national fanfare, but soon suffered severe technical difficulties.

The rover and the Chang'e 3 probe that carried it there were the first "soft landing" on the moon since 1976. Both the United States and the Soviet Union had accomplished the feat earlier.

China will launch a "core

module" for its first space station some time around 2018, a senior official said in April, part of a plan for a permanent manned space station in service around 2022.

Driverless car in Singapore collides with truck, no injuries

A self-driving car being tested on Singapore public roads collided with a truck on Tuesday, the city-state's transport regulator said, adding that no one was hurt.

"The test vehicle was changing lane when it collided with a truck," the Land Transport Authority said in a Facebook post.

nuTonomy, which is developing and testing the technology, said the car was operating with two engineers onboard and traveling slowly.

Countries around the world are encouraging the development of autonomous technologies, and Singapore, with its limited land and workforce, is hoping driverless vehicles will encourage its residents to use more shared vehicles and public transport.

Singapore's testing of the technology is being closely watched as tech firms and automakers race to build self-drive cars and develop new business plans for what is expected to be a long-term makeover of personal transport.

Four different groups are testing driverless cars in a western Singapore district. The test routes open to participants was doubled to 12 km (7.4 miles) last month.

Washboard abs, it now appears, are not just desirable for cosmetic reasons. A higher waist circumference and waist-to-hip ratio — or central obesity — can increase the risk of breast cancer by three times among South Asian women, a new study has found. The study, published recently by Elsevier, was conducted at the Tata Memorial Hospital and cites central obesity as a key risk factor for breast cancer among both premenopausal and postmenopausal women. Doctors who authored the study say the findings have a strong public health message — to control that expanding waistline, irrespective of age. The study also busts the BMI (body mass index) link to breast cancer. "High BMI protects pre-menopausal women from breast cancer, while a high BMI in post-menopausal women increases the risk. So, BMI is not an indicator. But central obesity, which is based on waist circumference, increases the risk three-fold for all kinds of breast cancers among both pre- and post-menopausal women," Dr. Rajesh Dikshit, professor of epidemiology and in-charge, Public Health, Tata Memorial Centre, who has co-authored the study, told The Hindu on Wednesday. A flabby abdomen is a breast cancer risk for all tumour subtypes, says the study. "Furthermore, the association of central obesity with increased insulin levels and insulin-like growth factors may stimulate the growth of breast cancer cells," it states. Conducted over nearly five years, the study had participants from across India, but a majority of them were from western parts of the country. The participants mapped their increase in body size (based on pictograms they were shown) from the time they were 10. Accelerated growth in the 10-20-year age category — be it weight or height — was identified as cause for concern. "If there is a sudden increase in weight from 10 to 20 years, it is reflective of accelerated growth and there is a risk of premenopausal breast cancer," said Dr. Dikshit, emphasising a point made in the study — it is not just the weight but the distribution of fat in the body. "Our results indicate that distribution of body fat, rather than BMI, is a more important risk factor for breast cancer in this Asian population," the study says. Dr. Dikshit further said that even if a woman's BMI is low or normal, but central obesity is high, she is at risk, pointing to the pattern observed in India where even lean women tend to have paunches.

The study points out that a large number of women enrolled into the study had a normal BMI but a high waist-to-hip ratio. "The relationship between obesity and breast cancer is complex, with different ethnic populations showing different patterns of risk," the study states. The study has been authored by the Centre for Cancer Epidemiology at Tata Memorial Centre, Mumbai, Centre for Global Health, US National Cancer Institute, among other premier institutions.

Ahmedabad: Indian spiritual leader Gurudev Sri Sri Ravi Shankar, whose messages for world peace are increasingly finding favor with nations in conflict, will address members of the French Parliament in Paris, a city ravaged last year in one of the world's dastardly terror attacks.

Gurudev will address the members of National Assembly and Senate of France on 18th and 19th October respectively at the behest of Paul Giacobbi, President of India France Parliamentary group and François Marc, the President of India France Group of Senators. The addresses will focus on conflict resolution and inter-confessional and inter cultural dialogue. Gurudev will address questions from French MPs after the sessions. Netflix subscriptions boom around world, shares jump 20 percent

Netflix Inc added over 50 percent more subscribers than expected in the third quarter as original shows such as "Stranger Things" drew new international viewers and kept U.S. customers despite a price hike, sending its shares soaring 20 percent in late trade.

The company's performance represented a turnaround from the previous quarter of disappointing subscription growth. Netflix, which has spent heavily to expand outside its home market, also said that it was on track to start harvesting "material global profits" next year, even as it raised spending on original programming.

Shares of Netflix rose to \$119.82 in extended trade from a close of \$99.80.

Netflix added about 3.20 million subscribers internationally in the third quarter, higher than the 2.01 million average analyst estimate. (bit.ly/2e2gsRD) In the United States, Netflix added 370,000 subscriptions, compared with analysts' estimate of 309,000, according to research firm FactSet StreetAccount.

"Investors appear laser focused on subscriber growth, and so long as Netflix delivers on that metric, investors will bid its shares up," said Wedbush Securities analyst Michael Pachter. However, Pachter said he thought the continuing cost of developing new shows would undermine plans to deliver material profits in 2017.

Samsung to compensate Galaxy Note 7 parts suppliers

Samsung Electronics Co Ltd said on Tuesday it will compensate component suppliers for the discontinued Galaxy Note 7 smartphones and consider giving them orders for other models to cushion the blow.

The world's top smartphone maker said it would fully pay for unused Note 7 parts that have already been manufactured, compensate suppliers for unfinished components and pay for materials bought to make Note 7 parts.

"Samsung will determine the inventory levels for the partner companies and carry out compensation quickly," the company said in a statement, without elaborating on how much it expected to pay.

The decision comes after some South Korean govern-

ment and central bank officials voiced concerns about the potential impact of the Note 7 crisis on the domestic economy. A deputy finance minister said the fallout could hurt the economy during the third and fourth quarters of the year.

Though most of Samsung's smartphones are manufactured overseas, the company is a key customer for many South Korean parts makers including Samsung Electronics affiliate Samsung Electro-Mechanics Co Ltd. Samsung last week permanently ended sales of the fire-prone Galaxy Note 7 smartphone less than two months after launch, a decision the company expects will cost \$5.5 billion in operating profit from the third quarter of 2016 to the first quarter of 2017.
